## Retrieving Commercial OEM codes in MIXIT II

- Under the Color Selection Screen in Mixit II, you have an option underneath "Select On" to choose
  - OEM
  - Fleetowner
  - Own
  - Mixed

OEM refers specifically to OEM truck builders such as International Truck, Mack, Freightliner, Etc.

Fleetowner refers to the specific fleet such as Coca-Cola, UPS, Wal-Mart, etc. Fleetowner does not refer to a specific OEM truck manufacturer; it applies only to the owner of the fleet.

In the past many have grouped these two distinctions together and referred to them only as "commercial vehicles". We need to understand and differentiate between OEM Vehicle Manufacturer's codes and specific Fleetowner codes. They are very different classifications.

Manufactures codes taken directly from the vehicle such as NAV9219 would get entered directly into the OEM option since this is an OEM builder color code.

FLNA3062 would get entered into the Fleetowner option since this is a specific fleet code (Coca-Cola) and not an OEM manufacturer's code

- To pull up OEM Truck Manufacturer's Codes, **you will enter the "make" type under OEM, not Fleetowners**. You can either type the whole name or use the shortcuts listed below. Common OEM truck manufacturers include:
  - International (NAV)
  - Mack (MAC)
  - Volvo (VOLT) \*

- Once you input the truck manufacturer, then you need to enter the OEM truck code or the competitive paint manufacturer's code into the OEM "Code" field. Remember when inputting the competitive or OEM codes that you always enter the prefix first and then the code (example = DPN0001). You can also do a "search all" by placing an asterisk (\*) after the competitive prefix. Those prefixes are as follows:
  - DP = DuPont
  - SW = Sherwin Williams
  - PPG = PPG
